Then Mr Arvind Ram and his team facilitated the virtual visit to Ahalya Sthan, the place famous for Ahalya,






At last, Regional Centre, Patna arranged virtual visit of Bodh Gaya (associated with Mahabodhi Temple a






creations of the young apprentices working under him.
