The University has been awarded second position in the national Swacch Campus Ranking 2019 of Higher Educational Institutions among the Non-Residential Universities by UGC. The total fresh enrollment of the University reached 7.36 lakhslast year and is expected to reach one million mark in 2020. This is only possible in a mega university like ours. Facility of online education has been restarted through the Centre for Online Education. To start with, three programmes namely Certificate in Russian Language(CRUL), Certificate in Arabic Language(CAL) and Certificate in Tourism Studies(CTS) have been offered online for the January 2020 cycle. Many more programmes are being added to this soon. Moreover, two certificate programmes having large enrollment like Certificate in Library Science(CLIS) and Certificate in Food and Nutrition(CFN) have been chosen for academic counselling sessions—through teleconference sessions. These sessions are being made available to the learners—through the Gyandarshan channel. More programmes—have been planned to be added to this list. All efforts are being put in by the University to enhance the accuracy, efficiency and transparency of the student support system by the integration of technology at every stage.

Many of the programmes which were being offered offline have been added to the online admission portal. This initiative of the university is going to save time and energy of the learners as well as the Regional Centre. The time and energy saved this way can be constructively utilized for providing better ICT-enabled support services to the learners.

The Regional Centre for the first time conducted the entrance Examination for BSc(Nursing) in its new premises. The Term End Examinations, December 2019 are being held now and a proposal has been submitted to the headquarters for the establishment of a Model Study Centre in the present building. With its outreach and extension activities, the Regional Centre plans to spread its network in the rural areas and facilitate the educational empowerment of the rural and disadvantaged population.

It gives me immense pleasure to introduce Shri Binay Kumar, a man of 82 pursuing his PhD from IGNOU in distance education. This issue carries an article by him titled "My Journey of Two Decades with ODL through IGNOU" in which he has given tips to the learners for time management and become successful as distance learners. I am sure his story of struggle and success would inspire our learners to give their best.

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#### FROM THE PEN OF AN OCTOGENARIAN PHD STUDENT OF IGNOU...... MY JOURNEY OF TWO DECADES WITH ODL THROUGH IGNOU

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At present I am a learner of IGNOU preparing for a research (Ph.D.) on the topic: 'Students Attrition and Dropout in Open and Distance Learning System: A Study of Bihar State"

We know that higher education plays a significant role in developing a modern society. My association with ODL system is about 20 years. I have completed PGDDE, MADE and M.Phil during this period. Before that I had served Govt. of Bihar for 34 years and retired as Research Officer (statistics) in the year December 1994 and had basic degree of M.A (Statistics) from Patna University.

#### Why Education?

In my earlier college days I had read somewhere a Sanskrit couplet:

विद्या ददाति विनयम, विनयम ददाति पात्रताम्। पात्रताम धन आप्नोति, धना धर्मः ततः सुखम्।।

Education provides humility and humility contributes to ability; Ability procures resources and resources provide dharma and bliss. It was my good luck that in my college days I got an association of a man-making-organization 'SATSANG'. The headquarters of 'SATSANG' was at Deoghar (Presently in Jharkhand) and the founder of that organization was a saint Sri Sri Thakur Anukal Chandra.

SATSANG requires every learner to cultivate three basic habits: (i) Jajan (self-exaltation), (ii) Jaajan (the exaltation of others) and (iii) Istabhriti (the maintenance of one's ideal)

It emphasizes that there are three basic habits which are the foremost duties of man. One must exert oneself for one's becoming and at the same time convince the environment to do the same. Man cannot get success by ignoring his environment. That is why it is in a man's interest to serve his environment.

These teachings and habits helped me to achieve humility in my character and inspire everyone to do good to the society. The next step for education is to achieve ability. Here comes the education system and the present Open and Distance Learning System to our help.

The ODL system is quite different from the conventional education system. The most important characteristic of the system is separation of the teacher and the learner and also learners from one another. Another characteristic of the system is its openness. A learner is free to study at any time convenient, from any location, within the confines of a course schedule. The learner has the freedom to choose his/her desired courses from any place, so there is no compulsion for a learner of a rural area to move to an urban area for education and thus it saves many expenses. In ODL system educational courses are comparatively



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less expensive that regular conventional courses. There is flexibility in the system with regard in entry requirements. A large number of learners can be enrolled and accommodated. It provides wider access to varied target groups. Learners, who are already employed somewhere and are in job and want to study can do so without taking a break from their job. There is no age limit for admission. The ODL system has been found to be beneficial to train teachers — particularly teachers who are already in post and whose level of previous training is insufficient. A large number of non-formal adult education programmes, particularly in health, agriculture and social welfare, are examples of the flexibility of this system.

Self-Learning Materials (SLM) in the form of printed course materials are made available at the door step of the learner. Besides SLM, electronic communication media is also used to provide instruction and maintain two – way communication between the institution and the learner. Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers are made available at the local level to bring the institution as close to the learner as possible and also for the purpose of providing assessment and feedback to the learners, to learn new skills and competencies and enhance their knowledge, at their own place and time.

#### **Time Management for ODL System and Effective Learning**

The first lesson I have learnt in my present journey with ODL through IGNOU is the skill of time management.

We all have 24 hours in a day and therefore, time management skill is one of the most important ingredients of success in learning as well as in life. A learner needs to be extra-disciplined to adjust the commitments for family, life, job, studies and recreation.

The first step is to observe and analyze your daily schedule and organize them as urgent, important and routine and take care to have at least 2 hours for studies daily. The other steps are to set daily objectives, keep time for leisure, keep things at proper place, avoid gossips and learn to say 'NO' for activities for which you are not responsible. It is also better to keep emergency time between two activities to work as shock absorber.

#### Five further next steps:

- (i) Planning and setting realistic goals
- (ii) Ability to be organized and systematic
- (iii) Learning to relax and take regular short breaks
- (iv) Avoiding interruptions, gossips, unnecessary activities
- (v) And your ability to remain motivated through personal records on achieving objectives.

Time management is very crucial for learning (STRIDE Hand Book No.2).

Through 'SATSANG' I was able to realize the goal of life and could cultivate these habits that inspired me to attend a world conference on distance education held first time in India in the year 1995 at New Delhi. After the conference I joined the programme PGDDE through the IGNOU Regional Centre Patna and with these experiences I have been inspired to do the present study.





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The basic fact that I have realized is that our perceptions about education and distance education are distorted and priorities have been misplaced. Our political leaders and policy makers have an idea that imparting high quality education to millions of learners at low cost through distance mode would reduce the financial burden on the government and the student unrest in the campuses.

When I was doing MADE, there was a provision to do a 'Project Work'. I wrote the Self-Instructional Materials (SIM) on Staff Development in Distance Education (Training the trainers group) titled, "Distance Education – Education for all" (A Holistic Approach to Education). The purpose was to emphasize "Spirituality must be interrelated with education for self-realization. But unfortunately I have never got the opportunity to see the 'ideas' mentioned there in put into practice. We, as a developing country, need to look for specific and peculiar realities concurring our academic traditions and not borrow ideas/courses from developed countries only.

We need planning, curriculum development, monitoring and evaluation mainly because they operate with limited time schedules and resources.

To conclude it needs to be mentioned that learning from the experience of the advanced countries is alright, but the ODL system of India must take its roots in the native soil of our country and it culture. We need to home-grow our own model of development based on our inherent strengths.

I must point out that the long journey I have been travellingthrough IGNOU is very inspiring with the natural surroundings of the campus of the IGNOU Headquarters at Maidan Garhi and the teachers in each school, their cordial hospitality to help the learners with their sweet behavior. Another point of IGNOU's attraction is the availability of a library with vast collection of books and journals that help a learner achieve his/her desired goal of knowledge. Time to time a learner gets an opportunity to attend workshops, seminars and occasional specious of learned academics that help to overlook the negative forces of environment and hazardous journey of life.

During myM.PhilProgramme course I got an opportunity to conduct 'A Study on Perception of Distance Teachers, Academic Counselors and Distance Learners of IGNOU on the Status of Distance Education in the Country'. During my M. Phil study I got an opportunity to meet several teachers, academic consultants and learners of ODL system. I met a learner Dr. Abhilash Nayak, the present Regional Director, IGNOU Regional Centre, Patna having 25 years of association with the IGNOU's ODL system whose comments dated 25.01.2016 based on his experience are still very true to be mentioned it in, "quality monitoring mechanism should be strengthened in order to enhance the credibility of distance education programmes among the public".

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#### IGNOU Starts Online Delivery of Question Papers for Certificate and Diploma Programmes from Term End Examinations, December, 2019

Centre for Online Education (COE) has been entrusted the responsibility to develop the application for Online Question Paper Delivery System for TEE. COE designed; developed and implemented this application in collaboration with SED in July 2019 for practical examinations. After successful implementation of first phase Online Question Paper Delivery System for practical examination in July 2019, IGNOU has implemented OQPDS for theory courses (at certificate and diploma level) during December 2019 TEE.

Question Paper Delivery System is an online platform for Delivery of Question Papers (QP) at the IGNOU exam centres. SED, RCs and Exam Centre are the main stakeholders of this application. The Management (VCO, Registrar SED) has access to the dashboard to monitor all activities during practical examination. This application includes modules on uploading of question paper in encrypted/secured environment, scheduling and automated delivery of question papers through systematic secured processes.

During December 2019, Pro Vice Chancellor, Prof. Ravindra Ramachandra Kanhere, visited COE for reviewing the system and appreciated the team members of COE and SED.









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#### Launch of ONLINE Certificate programmes from January, 2020 session

#### MA(Education) Programme added to the Online Admission Portal

With the approval of Competent Authority, MA (Education) Programme has been shifted from the category of Merit-based Programme to Regular Programme. Now admission to this programme shall be granted to all eligible applicants.

#### IGNOU Starts 10 digit Enrollment Numbers from January 2020

The fresh enrolment is 2019 exceeded 7.6 lakh mark and with rapidly increasing enrolment, the figure may reach 1 million mark very soon. In view of this, with due approval from the competent authority, it has been decided to shift from 9-digit to 10-digit enrolment number, while retaining the last digit as the 'check digit'. This new system will be effective from January 2020.

#### IGNOU Extends dates for Fresh Admission & Re-Registration for January 2020

With the approval of the competent authority the last dates for fresh admission and Re-Registration (Both online and offline) have been extended to 20<sup>th</sup> of January 2020. All the students are requested to take advantage of this facility and enroll themselves before the last date.
